

What exams will I do?

You will sit two exams, one less than in the summer

Paper	Topics	Time	Date
1	British Medicine Through Time	1 hour 20mins	4 th February
2	The Cold War <u>and</u> Elizabeth I	1 hour 45mins	10 th February
3	Weimar & Nazi Germany	Not covered, so no mock!	

Sitting two exams will allow you to practice the full suite of GCSE exams that you have studied so far and will give us the opportunity to give you a GCSE grade.

The papers are topics that have not yet come up on the summer exams and are a great opportunity to show off what great historians you have become these last 5 years.

We are giving you this information 6 weeks early so you have plenty of time to plan your revision.
